a. Birds

Blackbird, Blue Tit, Buzzard, Carrion Crow, Chaffinch, Coal Tit, Dunnock, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Great Tit, Grey Heron, Greylag Goose, Jay, Lapwing, Little Grebe, Mallard, Moorhen, Nuthatch, Pheasant, Raven, Robin, Song Thrush, Sparrowhawk, Treecreeper, Willow Tit, Wood Pigeon, Wren.

b. Mammals

Bank Vole, Mole, Rabbit, Red Squirrel.

c. Reptiles, Amphibians and Fish


Common Lizard, Frog, Toad, Stickleback.

d. Invertebrates

Alderfly nymph, Beetle larva, 'Bloodworm', Centipede, Common Green Grasshopper, Common Shiny Woodlouse, Earthworm, Earwig, Garden Spider, Gnat larva, Ground Beetle, Harvestman, Leech, Mayfly nymph, Midge larva, Millipede, Mosquito larva, Pea Mussel, Pond snail, Red Admiral Butterfly, Sawfly larva, Seven-spot Ladybird, Spiders (4 unidentified species).




Wed. 2 Red Squirrel Walk with Heinz Traut. There were no bookings for this event so it was cancelled.



Tues. 29 Ian Dunn, Pamela Beeton and Dayne Earl helped clear the stacked branches from a possible toilet site.


