

Sat. 4th **Anthony Ison** helped **Jim** cut and clear branches from along the sluice dyke the boardwalk.







Reserve path with 10mm sub-base then brought two loads of gabion stones for the new path, while **Steven Dalgliesh** helped **Jim** remove the first section of boardwalk and then replace it with the new hardcore path.





Tue. 21st In the morning, Steven Dalgliesh and Jim brought down an assortment of ladders and stripped the felt from the shelter roof. They then worked on the new path, removing the old boardwalk, while Alan Thomson and his boys, Willie McEwan and Euan Millar, fitted a new metal roof on the shelter.

In the afternoon, Jim continued working on the path, gathering gabion stones and laying them on terram membrane until he reached a tree stump that had to be cut shorter.

This allowed **Jim** to extend the Terram membrane and layer of gabion stones on Thursday 23rd and Friday 24th.

Sat. 25th Jim, helped by Anthony Ison, Lewis Carrick and Neil Stewart, extended the layer of gabion stones and added a layer of 40mm washed gravel to the first section of path.


