17th Jim raked up the dead leaves from the path through the Reserve.

10th Scott McLean (left), assisted by Chris Taylor (right), put the final touches to the hide's interior and attached right angle strips down the corners on the outside to cover and protect the ends of the boards.

13th & 14th Jim constructed ten hardwood display boards and fitted two escutcheons on the back and sunk four magnets into the front of each, ready for mounting on posts around the woodland trails for the Halloween Hunt at the end of the month.



21st Jim fitted non-slip strips on to the steps up to the new hide in the morning and then Steven **Dalgliesh** helped him fill in the potholes on the Eskrigg Farm road in the afternoon.
