# 1. All peaceful and quiet at Eskrigg pond on the 30<sup>th</sup> of June.



### 2. Confirmed wildlife sightings at the Reserve during June.

### a. Birds

Blackbird, Black-headed Gull, Blue Tit, Bullfinch, Buzzard, Carrion Crow, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Coal Tit, Collared Dove, Common Gull, Common Crossbill, Dunnock, Feral Pigeon, Goldfinch, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Great Tit, Greenfinch, Grey Heron, Grey Wagtail, Greylag Goose, House Sparrow, Jay, Lesser Redpoll, Long-tailed Tit, Mallard, Nuthatch, Osprey (spotted by Simon Amos), Pheasant, Red Kite, Robin, Siskin, Song Thrush, Sparrowhawk, Starling, Stock Dove, Swallow, Treecreeper, Whitethroat, Willow Warbler, Woodpigeon, Wren, Yellowhammer.

#### b. Mammals

Bank Vole, Hare, Mole, Rabbit, Red Squirrel, Roe Deer, Weasel.

### c. Insects

**Butterflies**: Green-veined White, Large White, Meadow Brown, Orange-tip, Red Admiral, Ringlet, Small Tortoiseshell. **Moths**: Chimney Sweeper, Clouded Border, Nettle-tap. **Other insects**: Grasshopper, Forest Bug (final instar).

### d. Fungi

Blackening Brittlegill, Blusher, Chanterelle, Common Eyelash, Dryad's Saddle.



## 4. June Activities at Eskrigg Reserve

11<sup>th</sup> Lockerbie Cubs did a stream study, with Jim, in the early evening. The children were surprised to find so many animals (freshwater shrimps, mayfly and stonefly nymphs, simulid and chironomid larvae and flatworms) in such a small stream.

## 5. Maintenance work at the Reserve and Woodland Walks in June.

- 1<sup>st</sup> Jim Rae met with Claire Simmonds and Graeme Urquhart regarding a work placement for Graeme.
- $2^{nd}$  Jim removed tree roots and levelled the next section of path.
- **3<sup>rd</sup> Jake Creighton** helped **Jim** lay gravel on the path to Pip's Corner.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Jim removed tree roots and levelled the next section of path.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Jim removed tree roots and levelled the next section of path.
- $6^{\text{th}}$  Jim strimmed and raked the path from the car park to the granite seat.
- 7<sup>th</sup> Jim and Graeme strimmed and raked the path from the granite seat to the shelter.
- $9^{th}$  Jim met with members of the ARSG and SSRS.
- 10<sup>th</sup> In the morning, Jim and Jake collected the generator from Galloway Hire Tools, where it had been for service and repair, and then took the road trailer to Paterson of Dalbeattie to order a new rear reflector. Meanwhile Norah Muirhead started to weed the Reserve path near the shelter. In the afternoon, Jim and Jake worked on the path to Pip's Corner.
- 11<sup>th</sup> Jim and Graeme strimmed and raked the sides of the path through the Reserve.
- 12<sup>th</sup> Jim and Zack Nicholson worked on the path to Pip's Corner during the afternoon.
- 13<sup>th</sup> Jim worked on the path to Pip's Corner.
- 14<sup>th</sup> Jim and Graeme worked on the path to Pip's Corner.
- 17<sup>th</sup> Jim and Jake worked on the path to Pip's Corner during the morning, while Norah weeded more of the Reserve path.
- 18<sup>th</sup> Jim and Graeme worked on the path in the afternoon.
- 20<sup>th</sup> Jim and Zack worked on the path in the afternoon.
- 21<sup>st</sup> Jim and Graeme finished laying gravel on the section of path to Pip's Corner.
- 24<sup>th</sup> In the morning, Norah continued weeding the path through the Reserve while Jim and Jake strimmed and raked the grass at the Cemetery entrance. In the afternoon, Jim and Jake pulled self-seeded birches in the heathland and pruned some of the trees round the heathland margins.
- 25<sup>th</sup> The Disabled Rambler's Rally was cancelled. Jim strimmed, and Graeme raked, the path opposite the Cemetery Lodge and started doing the side of the forest road.
- 26<sup>th</sup> Jim finished the strimming and raking of the forest road verge.
- 28<sup>th</sup> In the morning, Jim strimmed and tidied up the area around the old bench seat at the T-junction of the forest road before Graeme arrived to help Jim pull self-seeded birches in the heathland area.
