b. Mammals: Bank Vole, Common Shrew, Mole, Rabbit, Red Squirrel, Roe Deer, Woodmouse.



Butterflies: Green-veined White, Peacock (SS), Red Admiral, Small Copper (DA).


Adult Moths: Copper Underwing.

- 4. Construction and Maintenance Work during August.
 - Tue. 02 Gordon Reid, Sybille Spägele and Jim Rae took two loads of old timber and other waste materials to Oakbank in Dumfries for recycling.
 - Wed. 03 Sybille and Jim tidied up the timber storage area.
 - Fri. 05 Sybille and Jim cleared willows from the soakaway.



Wed. 10 Imogen Spence, Archie Jarvis, Gordon Reid and Sybille Spägele helped Jim to cut and clear willow trees along the southern boundary of the Reserve. Imogen and Archie were working towards their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award.





- Fri. 12 Imogen and Archie spent another morning cutting back and clearing trees along the southern Reserve boundary to allow more light to reach the solar panels and clear the soakaway.
- **Tue.16 Jim** and **Sybille** inspected the Woodland Walks in order to plan the maintenance work that will be required when the harvested timber has been cleared and the paths are opened up to the public again, e.g. bridge repairs, treatment of benches with wood preservative, pruning and strimming of vegetation and leveling of certain areas.
- **Wed. 17 Jim** strimmed and raked the areas around the Duck Feeder and Red Squirrel Hide.
- **Thu. 18 Jim** carried out some more survey work.
- **Thu. 25** Gordon Reid and Jim strimmed and raked the sides of the car park and the path from the car park down towards the granite seat in the morning. Jim completed the rest of the path in the afternoon.



Fri. 26 Lorna Kempsell brought a young Mute Swan from the **Wildlife Hospital** to the Reserve where it could be looked after and hopefully learn to survive in the wild. Over the next few days it explored the pond area and learned how to feed for itself. It seemed to be doing well and was quite contented. Its plumage is developing rapidly.

Mon. 29 Tom Hargreaves and **Jim** strimmed and raked the path from the granite seat towards the shelter.

Tue. 30 Sybille Spägele, Gordon Reid and Jim Rae completed the path to the shelter then tidied up the paths in the picnic area, around the apple trees and in towards the feeder burn. Gordon also raked some of the woodland walks.
